

PASSPORT LEATHER COVER



Assembly instructions

Difficulty level: Beginner
Completion Time: 2 - 4 hours

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NECESSARY TOOLS

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B&W Printer



Scissors or a cutter



Hole Puncher (We recommend 1.8 - 2 mm sized holes for this build)



Approx 1 square feet of leather. (We recommend 5-6oz leather for this build)



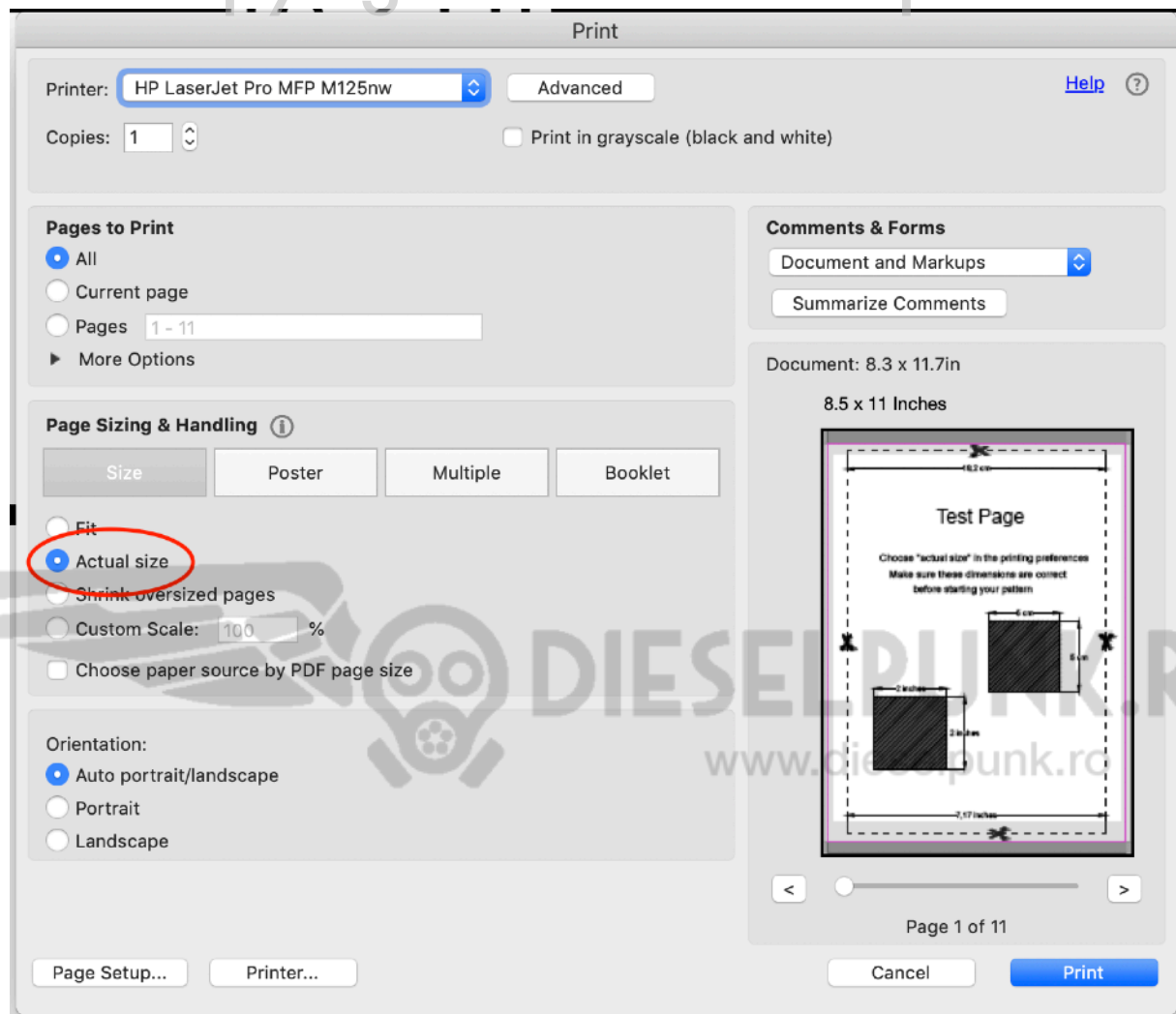
Thread and needles (We recommend 1 mm waxed thread for this build)



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PRINTING THE PATTERN

Set up your paper size to A4 and choose actual size in the printer settings



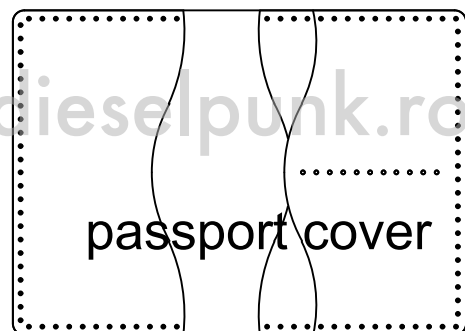
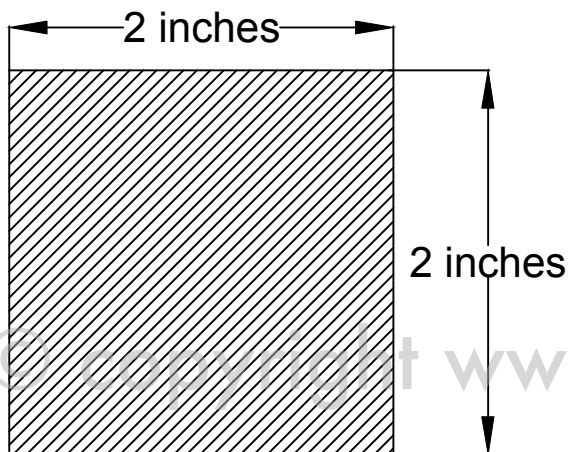
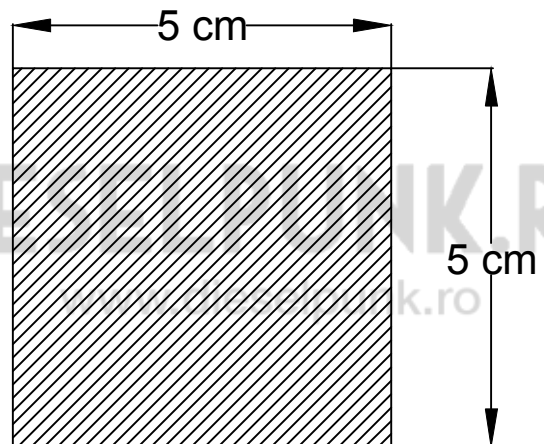
Alternatively you can use "letter" format which is approximately the same size and will not impact the size of the product significantly

Test Page

Select A4 in the paper size printing menu
Choose "actual size" in the printing preferences
Make sure these dimensions are correct
before starting your pattern

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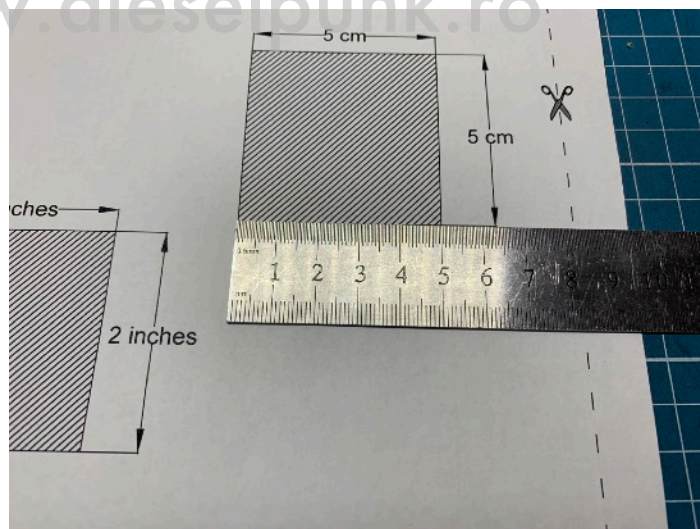
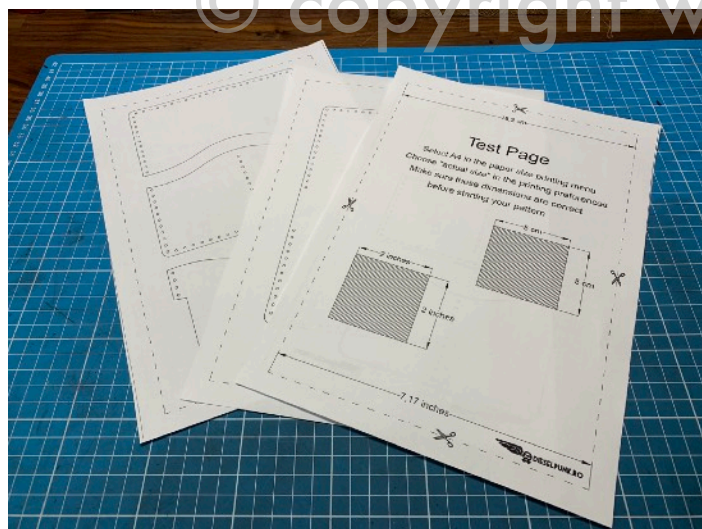
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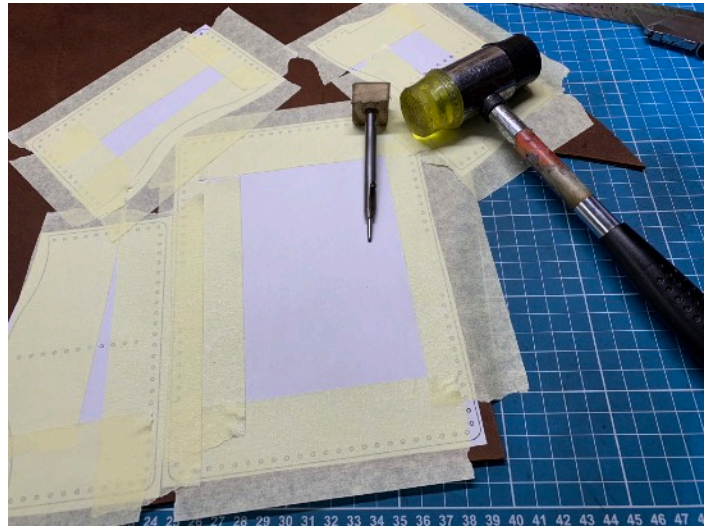
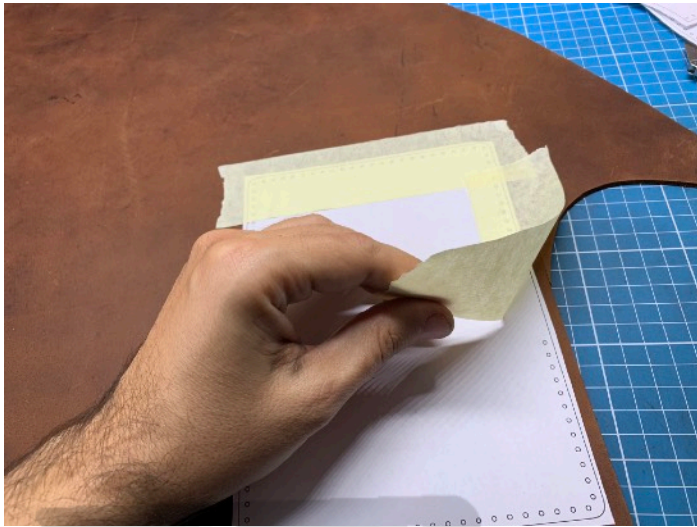
After you print the patterns make sure you have the correct scale by measuring the square with a ruler.



Cut the pattern pieces out. No need to cut exactly on the line at this stage



Paste them on the leather using masking tape



Punch all the holes and after cut the leather. I use a 1.5 mm hole puncher and 2 mm (6 oz) latigo leather which is a combination of chrome and veg tan



For the corners I use these punchers I got on ebay.



Punch all the holes and cut out all the pieces before you stitch them together



Time to stitch everything together. Start with these two pieces

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Then attach them both like I do in the pictures below



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First sleeve is ready, perfect
for holding credit cards



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Time to stitch the last sleeve
in place.
