Little Round Bag



Materials:

For body and bottom 3-4 oz medium to firm temper. Something here [Remove Watermark Now](#)
New Haven 3-4 oz and a chrome tan 6 oz for the strap.

Hardware:

1 x button stud
2 x swivel snaps or any other hooks you wanna use

Tools:

Scissors, knife (paper knife or rotary cutter would also work).

Stitching irons: my pattern is made for 5mm stitching irons (5 stitches per inch). If you are willing to use any other size please make sure that the hole count is the same where it has to be the same: the pocket seams, the vertical seams, the bottom and both front and back panels.

Needles - according to your thread size, a pair of harness needles.

Mallet, grommet setter, rivet setter, hole punch (3/8 for top holes and a small one for your button stud).

Instructions:

Print the pattern at actual size (100%). Use the reference on top of each page to make sure everything is printed correctly. Join the pages together. Cut the pieces.

First, sew the gusset to the front panel with overlapping seam, front panel being on top of the gusset. Align the corner hole of the gusset with every last hole on the front panel and complete the seam to the other end.

Sew the gusset onto the back panel: it's a flesh-to-flesh side seam, align the corner hole of the gusset with the first hole right below the horizontal stitching line (the alignment is shown on the back panel part of the pattern, refer to it when stitching these together).

When the gusset is sewn together with front and back panel attach the flap and complete the top seam.

Make the strap of desired length according to your measurements. I include a demplate for 1" but you can make whatever you like, even a piece of rope would work.:)


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
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BACK PANEL




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



FLAP

Adjust the size of the button hole according to the size of your button stud!




MEASURE THE DESIRED LENGTH. MINE IS 31"
